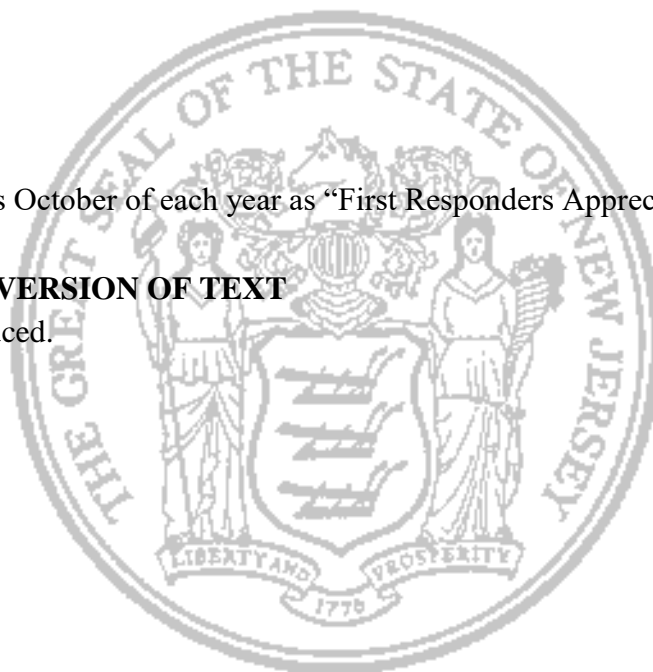

2 Responders Appreciation Month.”

4 **WHEREAS**, New Jersey’s first responders include paid and volunteer  
5 members of law enforcement agencies, fire departments, emergency  
6 medical services, and other organizations in the public safety sector  
7 who work tirelessly to keep the residents of this State safe by taking  
8 the call and responding in times of crisis; and

9 **WHEREAS**, First responders make a vital and irreplaceable  
10 contribution to our State with their willingness to make our  
11 communities stronger and safer; and

12 **WHEREAS**, In carrying out their duties, first responders frequently are  
13 called upon to put their own lives in jeopardy as they respond to  
14 dangerous and devastating incidents and disasters and, tragically,  
15 some have paid the ultimate price carrying out their devotion to  
16 service of others; and

17 **WHEREAS**, These burdens are carried not only by first responders, but  
18 also by their families and loved ones who make great personal  
19 sacrifices in order for the first responders to unstintingly serve the  
20 residents of this State; and

21 **WHEREAS**, The deep commitment exhibited by first responders to our
