1 A JOINT RESOLUTION designating the last week in April of each 2 year as "Reentry Week." 3 WHEREAS, The vast majority of ¹[people] individuals ¹ currently 4 serving sentences in ¹[New Jersey prisons and jails] State and 5 county correctional facilities will transition into communities 6 7 throughout the State when they ¹[leave] are released from ¹ incarceration; and 8 9 WHEREAS, Formerly incarcerated individuals face numerous 10 challenges that include finding work, housing, healthcare, ¹treatment¹, treatment, mental health 11 transportation ¹[and] in addition to ¹ reuniting with family, 12 which can lead to recidivism¹[,] and health, safety, and social 13 concerns; and 14 15 WHEREAS, Federal, State, and local leaders recognize these challenges and are working on policies and programs focused on 16 removing the barriers that prevent formerly incarcerated 17 ¹[people] <u>individuals</u> from pursuing healthy and productive 18 lives when they return to communities after serving time in 19 ¹[prison or in jail] correctional facilities¹; and 20 WHEREAS, The New Jersey Reentry Services Commission (RSC) is 21 charged with examining issues ¹[relating] related ¹ to prisoner 22 reentry, including, but not limited to, identifying specific 23 24 services that are necessary for successful reentry, identifying 25 current obstacles to inmates receiving these services, and 26 proposing solutions to remove these obstacles; and WHEREAS, In 2019 ¹, the RSC released a report that offered 100 27 practical action steps to improve the lives of those being released 28 29 from prison, with a focus on addiction treatment, healthcare, 30 legal issues, and employment training; and WHEREAS, The Commission on Reentry Services for Women 31 (CRSW) is charged with examining issues ¹ [relating] related ¹ to 32 women prisoner reentry including, but not limited to ¹[:], ¹ 33 identifying physical and psychological hardships endured while 34 incarcerated that may impede successful reentry ¹[;], 35 identifying¹ specific services that are necessary for successful 36 reentry¹[;], identifying¹ current obstacles to female prisoners 37 receiving these services ¹[;], ¹ and proposing solutions to remove 38 these obstacles; and 39 WHEREAS, In 2020 1,1 the CRSW released a report that offered 40
