1 A JOINT RESOLUTION permanently designating the first full week in April as the "Week of the Young Child" in New Jersey. 2

- WHEREAS, Learning and development are shaped by the earliest 4 5 years of a child's life; and
- 6 WHEREAS, The State's future depends on the high-quality early 7 childhood experiences provided to young children today, preparing them for school success and brighter outcomes; and 8
- 9 Providing high-quality early childhood education WHEREAS, 10 services represents a worthy commitment to our children's future 11 by preparing them to succeed in school, earn higher wages, and 12 live healthier lives; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Providing high-quality early childhood education services also makes working families more economically secure 14 15 by reducing child-care costs, thereby saving taxpayer dollars that would otherwise go to child care assistance programs dedicated 16 17 to low-income families; and
- 18 WHEREAS, Working families need a mixed-delivery early childhood education system where the quality of services is not 19 ¹[comprised] compromised by economic factors or lack of 20 21 accessibility when selecting child care arrangements that best 22 meet the needs of their family; and
- 23 WHEREAS, The State's early childhood education workforce needs 24 skilled, qualified, and adequately compensated early childhood 25 educators who reflect a diversity of linguistic, racial, and cultural identities, and provide children and families of this State with 26 developmentally appropriate child care services in educational 27 28 settings that are both accessible and affordable; and
- 29 The State of New Jersey needs to provide robust 30 subsidies, scholarships, and tax credits for families at all income 31 levels to help alleviate the true cost of high-quality early 32 childhood education; and
- WHEREAS, The Week of the Young Child ¹[(WOYC)]¹ is a week-33 long celebration that focuses public attention on the needs of 34 young children and their families, recognizes the programs and 35 services that meet those needs, and coordinates music, food, and 36 art activities to help develop children's math, literacy, and motor 37 skills; and 38
- 39 WHEREAS, The National Association for the Education of Young 40 Children (NAEYC), in partnership with state and local organizations, early childhood professionals, and families and 41 children, are celebrating ¹[the of] ¹ the ¹[WOYC] Week of the 42 Young Child¹ April 2 through April 8, 2022; and 43
- 44 WHEREAS, By calling attention to the need for high-quality early 45 childhood education services for all children and families within
