## **SYNOPSIS**

Urges immediate moratorium on sonar testing and wind turbine mapping due to recent unexplained deaths of marine life off the coast of New Jersey.

1	A SENATE RESOLUTION urging an immediate moratorium on sonar
2	testing and wind turbine mapping off the coast of New Jersey.

4	WHEREAS, There are multiple offshore wind energy projects under
5	development off the coast of New Jersey; and
6	WHEREAS, On March 6, 2023, the Board of Public Utilities decided to
7	solicit applications for even more offshore wind energy projects;
8	and
9	WHEREAS, Development of these offshore wind energy projects has
10	resulted in the increased use of sonar and other underwater mapping
11	technologies; and
12	WHEREAS, The increased use of sonar and other underwater mapping
13	technologies has the significant risk of interfering with marine
14	mammals' ability to hear, communicate, and navigate underwater;
15	and
16	WHEREAS, At the same time, there has been an unusual and significant
17	increase in the number of deaths of whales and dolphins off the
18	coast of New Jersey; and
19	WHEREAS, Since December 1, 2022, the National Oceanic and
20	Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) has recorded at least twelve
21	deaths of whales off the coast of New Jersey, eight of which have
22	been humpback whales; and
23	WHEREAS, In addition to whales, there were at least five recorded
24	deaths of dolphins in February 2023 alone; and
25	WHEREAS, The deaths of these whales and dolphins are largely
26	unexplained and remain under investigation; and
27	WHEREAS, Nevertheless, these whale and dolphin deaths occurred in
28	or near areas of offshore wind energy development; and
29	WHEREAS, The multiple and unprecedented occurrence of whale and
30	dolphin deaths in or near areas of offshore wind energy
31	development may be more than coincidental and warrants
32	investigation by the State and federal governments; and
33	WHEREAS, Numerous residents, businesses, environmental groups,
34	and elected officials along the coast of New Jersey have expressed
35	strong concern regarding the connection between this State's
36	offshore wind energy projects and the recent unexplained deaths of
37	whales and dolphins; and
38	WHEREAS, Notwithstanding the salutary benefits offered by renewable
39	offshore wind energy, the development of these projects should not
40	come at the expense of marine life; and
41	WHEREAS, The development of offshore wind energy projects off the
42	coast of New Jersey should therefore be paused while further
43	scientific study of these projects' impact on marine life is
44	conducted; and
45	WHEREAS, The Department of Environmental Protection and the
46	federal Bureau of Ocean Energy Management within the U.S.
47	Department of the Interior are the agencies primarily charged with
48	regulating these offshore wind energy projects; now, therefore,

 1. The Senate of the State of New Jersey urges the Department of Environmental Protection and the Bureau of Ocean Energy Management within the U.S. Department of the Interior to impose an immediate moratorium on sonar testing and wind turbine mapping off the coast of New Jersey, due to the recent unexplained deaths of whales and dolphins off the coast of New Jersey.

2. Copies of this resolution, as filed with the Secretary of State, shall be transmitted by the Secretary of the Senate to the Governor, the Commissioner of Environmental Protection, the President of the United States, and the U.S. Secretary of the Interior.

#### **STATEMENT**

This resolution urges the State and federal governments to impose an immediate moratorium on sonar testing and wind turbine mapping due to recent unexplained deaths of whales and dolphins off the coast of New Jersey.

Since December 2022, the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) has recorded at least twelve whale deaths off the coast of New Jersey, eight of which have been humpback whales. In addition, there were also five deaths of dolphins recorded in February 2023 alone.

Most of these deaths remain unexplained, but have occurred in or near areas of offshore wind energy development. Given the unprecedented number of these recent deaths, their occurrence in or near areas of offshore wind energy development may be more than coincidental and warrants State and federal investigation.

A possible cause of these deaths is the increased use of sonar and other underwater mapping technologies for the development of offshore wind energy projects, which may interfere with marine mammals' ability to hear, communicate, and navigate underwater.

Therefore, an immediate moratorium on sonar testing and wind turbine mapping for these offshore wind energy projects is urged, so that further scientific study of these projects' impact on marine life can be conducted.
