Urges Congress to make Election Day federal holiday in US.

A SENATE RESOLUTION urging Congress to make Election Day a

2	federal holiday in the United States.
3	Windstan Day which accurs annually on the first Tuesday
4	WHEREAS, Election Day, which occurs annually on the first Tuesday
5	after the first Monday in November, allows United States citizens to
6	exercise their fundamental right to vote; and
7	WHEREAS, Voting is a critical element of democracy because the
8	public is able to elect leaders and lawmakers, make decisions
9	concerning public policy, and express opinions at national, state
10	and local levels; and
11	WHEREAS, Eight states across the country, including New Jersey, and
12	the United States Territory of Puerto Rico have designated Election
13	Day as a state holiday to encourage civic participation in elections
14	and honor the nation's democratic rights; and
15	WHEREAS, On average, only half of the nation's voter-eligible public
16 17	votes during national general elections and a leading cause among eligible voters for not voting was having a conflicting schedule that
18	hindered their ability to vote; and
19	WHEREAS, Designating Election Day as a federal holiday will increase
20	voter participation by ensuring greater flexibility to vote and easing
21	some of the obstacles that negatively impact voter turnout, such as
22	work schedules, school schedules, and time constraints; and
23	WHEREAS, Other countries, such as Belgium, Austria, France
24	Germany, Australia, and New Zealand, whose elections occur on
25	weekends, and therefore do not interfere with citizens' work-week
26	schedules, have seen much higher voter turnout rates compared to
27	those in the United States; and
28	WHEREAS, Designating Election Day as a federal holiday will also
29	allow polling places to run more smoothly by spreading out the
30	number of voters throughout the day and by limiting long morning
31	and evening voting lines, which are currently problematic to those
32	who are only able to vote before or after work; and
33	WHEREAS, Increasing voter participation will also ensure elections are
34	more representative of the country and its communities; and
35	WHEREAS, Respecting and championing the vote is essential to
36	maintaining the highest ideals of the United States, such as liberty.
37	justice, and equality, and for this reason, Election Day should be
38	celebrated throughout the nation; now, therefore,

40	BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the State of New Jersey:

42	1. This House urges Congress to make Election Day a federal

5	STATEMENT

7	This resolution urges Congress to make Election Day, which
8	occurs each year on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in the
9	month of November, as a federal holiday in the United States.
10	Voting is the most important civic duty granted to the public by
11	the United States Constitution. By voting, the public is able to
12	express their choice for who represents the country as public
13	officials and lawmakers and for important public policy decisions.
14	However, it is essential to increase voter participation and turnout
15	in order to ensure elections are truly representative of the public.
16	Designating Election Day as a federal holiday in the United States
17	would increase voter turnout by easing some of the obstacles
18	deterring voters and ensuring greater voter flexibility. In addition,
19	it would emphasize to the public that the election process, and each
20	vote, matters.
21	For these reasons, Congress is urged to make Election Day a
22	federal holiday in the United States.
