1 AN ACT authorizing waiver of the motorcycle road test for certain
2 veterans and amending P.L.1991, c.452.

4 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State
5 of New Jersey:

7 1. Section 6 of P.L.1991, c.452 (C.39:3-10.31) is amended to
8 read as follows:

9 6. a. The Chief Administrator of the Motor Vehicle
10 Commission may waive the written law and knowledge and road
11 test portion of the examinations required for a motorcycle license or
12 endorsement under R.S.39:3-10 for the holder of an examination
13 permit who has successfully completed a motorcycle safety
14 education course established under the provisions of section 1 of
15 P.L.1991, c.452 (C.27:5F-36).

16 b. The chief administrator shall waive the motorcycle road test
17 required for a motorcycle license or endorsement under R.S.39:3-10
18 for any applicant providing documentation upon application of
19 honorable discharge from a branch of the Armed Forces of the
20 United States and successful completion of a Motorcycle Safety
21 Foundation course on any United States military base.

STATEMENT

29 This bill requires the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission to
30 waive the motorcycle road test for a motorcycle license applicant
31 who provides documentation of honorable discharge from a branch
32 of the Armed Forces of the United States and successful completion
33 of a Motorcycle Safety Foundation course on any United States
34 military base.
