AN ACT concerning the harassing or taking of certain wildlife at 1 2 competitive events, and supplementing Title 23 of the Revised 3 Statutes. 4 5 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 6 of New Jersey: 7 8 1. As used in this act: 9 "Competitive event" means any activity, competition, contest, 10 derby, tournament, or other organized activity where participants are encouraged to take wildlife and are rewarded by the receipt of a prize 11 12 or any kind of inducement or reward. 13 "Covered wildlife" means a bobcat, coyote, crow, fox, mink, 14 opossum, rabbit, raccoon, skunk, squirrel, weasel, woodchuck, or the 15 dead body or parts thereof. "Division" means the Division of Fish and Wildlife in the 16 17 Department of Environmental Protection. 18 "Harass" means to annoy, attack, disrupt normal behavior patterns 19 of, or otherwise disturb wildlife without taking it. "Person" means any individual, association, estate, firm, joint 20 venture, limited liability corporation, organization, partnership, 21 22 receiver, syndicate, trust, or other legal entity. 23 "Take" means to hunt, capture, kill, trap, catch, net, possess, or 24 collect, or to attempt to hunt, capture, kill, trap, catch, net, possess, or collect, wildlife. 25 26 2. a. 27 Except in conjunction with a field trial or field day 28 authorized by a license issued pursuant to R.S.23:4-26, it shall be 29 unlawful: 30 (1) to harass or take covered wildlife at a competitive event; or 31 (2) for any person to organize, sponsor, promote, conduct, or 32 participate in a competitive event at which the participants harass or 33 take covered wildlife. 34 b. A person who violates this section shall be guilty of a 35 disorderly persons offense and, in addition to the applicable penalties 36 pursuant to Title 2C of the New Jersey Statutes, shall be subject to a 37 five-year suspension of: 38 (1) any license or permit issued to the person by the Division of 39 Fish and Wildlife; and 40 (2) all privileges to take or possess wildlife. 41 c. Any covered wildlife injured as a result of a competitive event 42 held in violation of this section shall be transported to a licensed 43 wildlife rehabilitator or State licensed veterinarian for proper treatment 44 or, if necessary, the administration of humane euthanasia. Euthanasia 45 shall only be administered after the best efforts to rehabilitate and 46 release the animal have failed. d. The Division of Fish and Wildlife shall forfeit the remains of 47 any covered wildlife killed at a competitive event held in violation of 48

this section, or euthanized pursuant to subsection c. of this section, 2 from the organizer, participant, or promotor in possession thereof, as 3 applicable. It shall become the property of the division. 4 e. The provisions of this section may be enforced by municipal 5 police officers, the State Police, and law enforcement officers in the 6 Division of Fish and Wildlife and the Division of Parks and Forestry in 7 the Department of Environmental Protection. 8 9 3. This act shall take effect immediately. 10 11 12 **STATEMENT** 13 14 This bill prohibits the harassing or taking of certain wildlife 15 (defined as "covered wildlife" in the bill) at a competitive event, 16 except in conjunction with a field trial or field day authorized by a 17 license issued pursuant to R.S.23:4-26. The bill also prohibits any 18 person from organizing, sponsoring, promoting, conducting, or 19 participating in a competitive event at which the participants harass 20 or take covered wildlife except in conjunction with such an authorized field trial or field day. "Covered wildlife" is defined as a 21 22 bobcat, coyote, crow, fox, mink, opossum, rabbit, raccoon, skunk, 23 squirrel, weasel, woodchuck, or the dead body or parts thereof. 24 The bill provides that a person who violates the prohibitions in 25 the bill would be guilty of a disorderly persons offense and, in 26 addition to the applicable penalties pursuant to Title 2C of the New 27 Jersey Statutes, would also have suspended for five years: 28 1) any license or permit issued to the person by the Division of 29 Fish and Wildlife; and 30 2) all privileges to take or possess wildlife. 31 A disorderly persons offense is subject to a penalty of up to six 32 months of imprisonment, a fine up to \$1,000, or both.

33 This bill requires any covered wildlife injured as a result of a 34 competitive event to be transported to a licensed wildlife 35 rehabilitator or State licensed veterinarian for proper treatment or to 36 be euthanized if necessary. The bill authorizes the Division of Fish 37 and Wildlife to forfeit the remains of any covered wildlife killed at 38 a competitive event held in violation of this bill or euthanized as a 39 result of the competitive event. Forfeited remains would become property of the Division of Fish and Wildlife. The bill directs 40 municipal police officers, the State Police, and law enforcement 41 officers in the Division of Fish and Wildlife and the Division of 42 43 Parks and Forestry in the Department of Environmental Protection 44 to enforce the bill's provisions.
