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AN ACT concerning school district staffing vacancies and 1 2 supplementing chapter 6 of Title 18A of the New Jersey Statutes. 3 4 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 5 of New Jersey: 6 7 1. As used in this act: "Novice teacher" means a teacher eligible to work under a valid 8 certificate of eligibility or certificate of eligibility with advanced 9 standing who has not yet been issued a provisional certificate. 10 "School district" means a school district, charter school, 11 renaissance school project, county special services school district, 12 ¹[or]¹ county vocational school district ¹, or approved private 13 school for students with disabilities¹. 14 15 2. a. The ¹<u>Department of Labor and Workforce Development</u>, 16 in consultation with the¹ Department of Education $\frac{1}{2}$ shall, within 17 180 days of the effective date of this act, establish and maintain a 18 database of novice teachers that shall be available to school districts 19 20 and novice teachers to assist in filling staffing vacancies. The 21 database shall not be available to the general public. 22 b. The ¹Commissioner of Education shall provide the following information for each novice teacher to the Department of Labor and 23 Workforce Development to be included in the¹ database ¹[shall 24 include the following information for each novice teacher] 25 26 established pursuant to subsection a. of this section¹: 27 (1) the novice teacher's name, telephone number, email address, 28 and method by which a school district may contact the novice 29 teacher; 30 (2) the novice teacher's current employment status; 31 (3) the certificate and endorsement held by the novice teacher; 32 and 33 (4) any other information the Commissioner of Education deems 34 necessary. c. The ¹[department] <u>Commissioner of Labor and Workforce</u> 35 Development¹ shall develop a mechanism by which a novice 36 teacher may opt out of inclusion in the database. A novice teacher 37 38 may request to be excluded from the database at any time. d. A novice teacher may request ¹[the department limit]¹ the 39 contact information included in the database pursuant to paragraph 40 (1) of subsection b. of this section ${}^{1}\underline{be limited}{}^{1}$ to a preferred 41 method of contact. 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Workforce Development¹ shall comply with a request made by a
 novice teacher pursuant to this subsection.

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3. a. The ¹Department of Labor and Workforce Development,
in consultation with the¹ Department of Education ¹,¹ shall hold
three job fairs per year to assist school districts in filling staffing
vacancies, with one job fair held in each of the northern, central,
and southern regions of the State.

9 b. (1) The ¹[department] <u>Commissioner of Education</u>¹ shall
10 invite school districts to participate in the job fairs.

(2) The job fair shall be open to novice teachers included in the
database established pursuant to section 2 of this act, individuals
enrolled in an educator preparation program, and any other
individual appropriately certified to work in a public school in the
State.

c. The ¹[department] <u>Commissioner of Labor and Workforce</u>
<u>Development</u>¹ shall notify each novice teacher included in the
database established pursuant to section 2 of this act of the date,
time, and location of each job fair.

d. The ¹[department] <u>Commissioner of Labor and Workforce</u>
<u>Development</u>¹ may charge employer participants a reasonable,
nominal fee to participate in a job fair held pursuant to this section.
The fee obtained pursuant to this subsection shall only be used to
cover costs associated with identifying and securing a location for
the job fair, hospitality services, and other administrative costs as
determined by the commissioner.

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4. This act shall take effect immediately.
