SYNOPSIS

Requires health insurance coverage of standard fertility preservation services for individuals with certain menstrual disorders resulting in infertility.

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AN ACT concerning health insurance coverage of fertility 1 2 preservation services, amending various parts of the statutory 3 law, and supplementing Title 26 of the Revised Statutes. 4 5 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 6 of New Jersey: 7 8 1. (New section) The Legislature finds and declares that: 9 A menstrual disorder is an abnormal condition related to the a 10 menstrual cycle and affects up to 25% of women of childbearing 11 age. 12 b. Certain menstrual disorders, including endometriosis, menorrhagia, and uterine fibroids, have an increased risk of causing 13 14 infertility. 15 c. Fertility preservation services, including the cryopreservation of embryos and oocytes, can protect an 16 17 individual's ability to bear children by protecting eggs and 18 reproductive tissue. 19 20 2. Section 1 of P.L.2019, c.306 (C.17:48-6rr) is amended to 21 read as follows: 22 1. a. A hospital service corporation contract which provides 23 hospital or medical expense benefits for groups with more than 50 24 persons and is delivered, issued, executed or renewed in this State, or approved for issuance or renewal in this State by the 25 26 Commissioner of Banking and Insurance, on or after the effective 27 date of this act, shall provide coverage for standard fertility 28 preservation services when a medically necessary treatment may 29 directly or indirectly cause iatrogenic infertility or when an 30 individual is diagnosed with a menstrual disorder that may result in 31 infertility. 32 For the purposes of this section: "Iatrogenic infertility" means an impairment of fertility caused 33 34 by surgery, radiation, chemotherapy, or other medical treatment affecting reproductive organs or processes. 35 36 "May directly or indirectly cause" means a medical treatment 37 with a likely side effect of iatrogenic infertility as established by the 38 American Society for Reproductive Medicine, the American 39 Society of Clinical Oncology, or as defined by the New Jersey 40 Department of Health. 41 "Menstrual disorder" means an abnormal condition related to the menstrual cycle, which shall include, but not be limited to, 42 43 menorrhagia, endometriosis, and uterine fibroids. 44 "Standard fertility preservation services" means procedures 45 consistent with established medical practices and professional

Section 5 of P.L.2019, c.306 (C.26:2J-4.43) is amended to 36 read as follows: 37 5. a. A health maintenance organization contract that provides 38 hospital or medical expense benefits for groups with more than 50 persons and is delivered, issued, executed or renewed in this State, 39 or approved for issuance or renewal in this State by the 40 41 Commissioner of Banking and Insurance, on or after the effective 42 date of this act, shall provide coverage for standard fertility 43 preservation services when a medically necessary treatment may 44 directly or indirectly cause iatrogenic infertility or when an 45 individual is diagnosed with a menstrual disorder that may result in 46 infertility.

The School Employees' Health Benefits Commission shall ensure that every contract purchased by the commission on or 39 40 after the effective date of this act that provides hospital or medical 41 expense benefits shall provide coverage for standard fertility 42 preservation services when a medically necessary treatment may 43 directly or indirectly cause iatrogenic infertility or when an 44 individual is diagnosed with a menstrual disorder that may result in 45 infertility.

This act shall take effect on the 90th day next following 37 enactment and shall apply to policies or contracts delivered, issued, or renewed on or after that date. 38 39 40 41 **STATEMENT** 42 43 This bill requires health insurance coverage of standard fertility 44 preservation services for individuals with certain menstrual 45 disorders resulting in infertility. 46 Under the bill, health insurance carriers (which include hospital 47 service corporations, medical service corporations, health service 48 corporations, health maintenance organizations authorized to issue

health benefits plans in New Jersey, group health insurance 1 2 policies, and any entities contracted to administer health benefits in 3 connection with the State Health Benefits Program and School 4 Employees' Health Benefits Program) will be required to cover 5 standard fertility preservation services when an individual is 6 diagnosed with a menstrual disorder that may result in infertility. For the purposes of this bill, a "menstrual disorder" is an abnormal 7 8 condition related to the menstrual cycle, which shall include, but is 9 not limited to, menorrhagia, endometriosis, and uterine fibroids.
