Allows interment of cremated pet remains in certain cemeteries.

1 AN ACT concerning the interment of cremated pet remains in 2 certain cemeteries and amending and supplementing P.L.2003, 3 c.261. 4 5 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 6 of New Jersey: 7 1. Section 2 of P.L.2003, c.261 (C.45:27-2) is amended to read 8 9 as follows: 10 2. The following definitions, unless the context indicates 11 otherwise, apply to this act: 12 "Annual, endowed or special care" means care or maintenance of 13 an individual interment space provided for by agreement between 14 the cemetery and the owner of the space. 15 "Board" means the New Jersey Cemetery Board. 16 "Burial" means disposition of human remains by placing them in a grave or crypt, but does not include their temporary storage. 17 18 "Burial right" means a right for the burial of human remains in a 19 particular grave or crypt created by contract between a person and a 20 cemetery. 21 "Cemetery" means any land or place used or dedicated for use 22 for burial of human remains, cremation of human remains, or 23 disposition of cremated human remains. 24 "Cemetery company" means a person that owns, manages, 25 operates or controls a cemetery, directly or indirectly, but does not include a religious organization that owns a cemetery which 26 27 restricts burials to members of that religion or their families unless 28 the organization has obtained a certificate of authority for the 29 cemetery. "Columbarium" means a building or structure containing niches 30 31 for placement of cremated human remains. 32 "Cremated human remains" means the recoverable bone 33 fragments and container residue resulting from the process of cremation of human remains or of a deceased human being. 34 "Cremated pet remains" means the recoverable bone fragments 35 36 and container residue resulting from the process of cremation of pet 37 remains or of a deceased pet. "Cremation" means the process of reducing human or 38 39 pet remains to bone fragments through flame, heat and vaporization. "Crematory" means a structure containing cremation chambers 40 41 used to cremate human remains. 42 "Crypt" means an interment space in a mausoleum or other 43 structure, above or below ground. 44 "Embellishment" means an item contributing to beauty, comfort 45 or enhancement of a cemetery, but does not include a memorial or a disposable, perishable or seasonal item. 46

EXPLANATION – Matter enclosed in **bold-faced brackets** [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted in the law.

Matter underlined <u>thus</u> is new matter.

1 "General maintenance charge" means a fee assessed against each 2 interment space for the general upkeep of the cemetery. 3 "Grave" means a place for underground disposition of human remains or cremated human remains. A grave may include spaces 4 5 for the disposition of human remains of more than one person, 6 arranged by depth. 7 "Human remains" means a body, or part of a body, of a deceased 8 human being. 9 "Interment" means the disposition of human remains or cremated 10 pet remains by burial in a grave or crypt but does not mean the 11 temporary storage of remains. 12 "Interment space" means a grave or crypt intended for the interment of human remains. 13 14 "Maintenance" means all activities of a cemetery company 15 which further the care and upkeep of a cemetery, including cutting 16 lawns, and preservation and repair of drains, water lines, roads, 17 buildings, fences and other structures. "Maintenance and preservation" means the care of the entire 18 19 cemetery to the extent of the income of the Maintenance and 20 Preservation Fund; it does not include providing specific care to 21 individual graves or plots. 22 "Mausoleum" means a permanent building in a cemetery above 23 or below ground, containing crypts to be used for burial. 24 "Memorial" means a marker or monument located at a grave 25 containing the name of a deceased person or the family name of a 26 deceased person, or an effigy or other representation of a deceased 27 person buried in the grave. It does not include an embellishment. "Niche" means a space in a columbarium or mausoleum for 28 29 placement of cremated human remains or both cremated human 30 remains and cremated pet remains. "Path" means a course or way intended to provide pedestrian 31 32 access to interment spaces. "Person" includes an individual, corporation, partnership, 33 34 association or any other public or private entity. 35 "Pet" means any domesticated animal normally maintained in or near the household of the owner thereof. 36 37 "Plot" or "lot" means an area of cemetery ground containing two 38 or more adjoining graves. 39 "Private mausoleum" means a mausoleum constructed by or for 40 a plot owner and not owned by the cemetery. 41 "Public mausoleum" means a mausoleum, built in accordance with regulations of the Department of Community Affairs, owned 42 by a cemetery or cemetery company with the intention of use of 43 44 interment spaces in it by the general public. A mausoleum is 45 distinguished from a single or multiple vault in that it is a single 46 integrated structure assembled on the premises. It shall not consist 47 of one or more vaults constructed off the cemetery premises and 48 installed singly or in series at the cemetery premises.

1 "Roadway" means a course or way intended to provide vehicle 2 access to interment spaces. 3 "Vault" means a prefabricated outer burial case of any material, designed to be installed in the ground to receive one or more 4 5 burials, and not a part of a public or private mausoleum or any other 6 structure. 7 (cf: P.L.2011, c.230, s.1.) 8 9 Section 16 of P.L.2003, c.261 (C.45:27-16) is amended to 2. 10 read as follows: 11 16. a. A cemetery company shall: 12 (1) adopt reasonable regulations for the use, management and 13 protection of the cemetery and of all interment spaces in it; for regulating the dividing marks between graves; for prohibiting or 14 15 regulating the erection of structures; for preventing unsightly 16 monuments, effigies and structures within the cemetery, and for 17 their removal; 18 (2)fix reasonable charges for interment spaces, niches, 19 products and services offered by the cemetery company; and 20 (3) keep its books, records and accounts so as to reflect the 21 conduct of its business. 22 b. A cemetery company may: 23 (1) prohibit the placement of memorials, effigies or structures 24 on parts of the cemetery and adopt reasonable regulations relating 25 to uniformity, class, composition, material, kinds and sizes of all 26 markers, monuments and other structures within the cemetery 27 provided that the regulations are not established to prevent 28 competition; 29 (2) sell adornments, embellishments, sod and plantings for use 30 in the cemetery; 31 (3) prevent the use of interment spaces or niches for purposes that violate the cemetery restrictions and regulations; 32 33 (4) regulate the conduct of persons and prevent improper 34 assemblages in the cemetery; 35 (5) reserve to the cemetery the exclusive right to open and fill graves, furnish equipment, manufacture and install foundations, set 36 37 and seal crypts and vaults, seal niches and install flush memorials; 38 (6) regulate or prevent the introduction of embellishments or 39 plants within the cemetery; 40 (7) prevent the interment in any interment space of human 41 remains not entitled to interment there; 42 (8) as provided in this act, make provisions for the removal at the cost of the lot owner of any memorial, effigy or structure when 43 44 either placed in violation of cemetery company rules and 45 regulations or when it becomes dangerous or unsightly; [and] 46 to the extent allowed by the regulations of the board, (9) 47 prohibit the interment of human remains or the placement of any

1 memorial when there are any outstanding charges against the 2 interment space; and 3 (10) prohibit the interment of cremated pet remains. A cemetery company, and any person engaged in the 4 С 5 management, operation or control of a cemetery owned by a cemetery company, directly or indirectly, is specifically prohibited 6 7 from engaging, directly or indirectly, in any of the following 8 activities: 9 (1) the manufacture or sale of memorials: 10 (2) the manufacture or sale of private mausoleums; 11 (3) the manufacture or sale of vaults, including vaults installed 12 in a grave before or after sale and including vaults joined with each 13 other in the ground; and (4) the conduct of any funeral home or the business or 14 15 profession of mortuary science; provided that crematoriums 16 operated in conjunction with funeral homes prior to December 1, 17 1971 are excepted from the provisions of this paragraph (4). 18 (cf: P.L.2003, c.261, s.16) 19 20 (New section) a. Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, 3. a cemetery may permit the interment of cremated pet remains. If a 21 22 cemetery permits the interment of cremated pet remains, the 23 interment shall be available to a lot owner only if: 24 (1) the interment takes place simultaneously with the interment 25 of human remains: and 26 (2) written authorization has been provided by the cemetery 27 company to the lot owner authorizing the interment of cremated pet 28 remains. 29 b. The cemetery company shall provide a list of charges for the 30 interment of cremated pet remains. Payments received for interment of cremated pet remains shall be deposited in the 31 cemetery company's Maintenance and Preservation Fund. 32 33 Cremated pet remains shall not be interred in a c. 34 columbarium or public mausoleum. Nothing in this section shall obligate a cemetery company to 35 d. allow interment of cremated pet remains where prior approval has 36 37 not been received at the time of sale or in advance of need. 38 39 4. This act shall take effect immediately. 40 41 42 **STATEMENT** 43 44 This bill allows cremated pet remains to be interred alongside 45 human remains in a cemetery. The interment of cremated pet 46 remains shall take place simultaneously with the interment of human remains, and a cemetery company must provide written 47 48 approval for the interment of cremated pet remains to the lot owner

authorizing the interment of cremated pet remains. The cemetery is
required to provide a list of any charges related to the interment to
the customer. Cremated pet remains may not be interred in a
columbarium or public mausoleum.
The bill defines "cremated pet remains" as the recoverable bone

- 6 fragments and container residue resulting from the process of
- 7 cremation of a pet. The bill allows a cemetery company to deny the
- 8 interment of cremated pet remains in the cemetery.
