1 **A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION** reconstituting the “Joint Committee
2 on Economic Justice and Equal Employment Opportunity.”

4 **BE IT RESOLVED** *by the General Assembly of the State of New*
5 *Jersey (the Senate concurring):*

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7 1. The “Joint Committee on Economic Justice and Equal
8 Employment Opportunity,” created by the 216th Legislature and
9 reconstituted in the 218th and 219th Legislature, is reconstituted.
10 The joint committee shall consist of 10 members of the Legislature,
11 from either House, regardless of political party affiliation, who shall
12 be appointed by the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the
13 General Assembly, as appropriate, and nominated as follows: four
14 members nominated by the President of the Senate; one member
15 nominated by the Senate Minority Leader; four members nominated
16 by the Speaker of the General Assembly; and one member
17 nominated by the Assembly Minority Leader. All members shall
18 serve without compensation and vacancies in the membership of the
19 joint committee shall be filled in the same manner as the original
20 appointments are made.

22 2. The joint committee shall adopt rules for the operation and
23 the conduct of its business, including the election of a chair or co-
24 chairs as it may determine from among its members, and select a
25 secretary who need not be a member of the joint committee.

27 3. The joint committee is authorized, empowered, and directed
28 to conduct a continuing study of issues concerning economic justice
29 and equal employment opportunity in this State. The joint
30 committee, in its endeavor to study these issues, shall meet and hold
31 hearings at places, throughout the State, as it shall designate during
32 the sessions or recesses of the Legislature.

34 4. The joint committee shall be entitled to call to its assistance
35 and avail itself of the services of the employees of the Legislative
36 Services Commission. The joint committee shall also be entitled to
37 employ such stenographic and clerical assistants and incur such
38 traveling and other miscellaneous expenses as may be authorized by
39 the presiding officers of the Houses, in order to perform its duties,
40 and as may be within the limits of funds appropriated or otherwise
41 made available to it for its purposes.

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43 5. The joint committee shall report its findings to the
44 Legislature on a routine basis, and may make other reports as it
45 deems necessary or desirable.

1 STATEMENT

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3 This concurrent resolution reconstitutes the “Joint Committee on
4 Economic Justice and Equal Employment Opportunity,” which was
5 created by the 216th Legislature, and reconstituted in the 218th
6 Legislature.

7 The concurrent resolution provides that the joint committee is
8 authorized, empowered, and directed to conduct a continuing study
9 of issues concerning economic justice and equal employment
10 opportunity in this State. The joint committee, in its endeavor to
11 study these issues, shall meet and hold hearings at places,
12 throughout the State, as it shall designate during the sessions or
13 recesses of the Legislature.
