Designates first full week of June of each year as “New Jersey Fishing and Boating Week.”

1 **A JOINT RESOLUTION** designating the first full week of June of
2 each year as “New Jersey Fishing and Boating Week.”

3
4 **WHEREAS**, Fishing and boating are cornerstones of the American
5 recreational experience, connecting residents to the outdoors and
6 promoting healthy living and environmental stewardship; and

7 **WHEREAS**, In 2012, an estimated 47 million Americans participated in
8 fishing, making one billion outings, and 46 million Americans
9 participated in boating, making 805 million outings – 58 percent of
10 which involved fishing; and

11 **WHEREAS**, In New Jersey, 766,000 anglers spent a total of 9.5 million
12 days fishing in 2011, with the vast majority of New Jersey residents
13 choosing to remain in-State to fish; and

14 **WHEREAS**, New Jersey’s State parks and natural areas, 127 miles of
15 coastline, hundreds of miles of bayshore, and numerous inland
16 lakes and tributaries provide countless fishing and boating
17 opportunities; and

18 **WHEREAS**, New Jersey also offers some of the best and most diverse
19 fishing in the country, including saltwater fishing for striped bass
20 and flounder, and stream fishing for brook trout; and

21 **WHEREAS**, In addition to great fishing, New Jersey hosts a variety of
22 boating activities, such as sailing, cruising, dining and entertaining,
23 nature observation, and water sports, all of which are available
24 along the Jersey Shore and the State’s numerous inland lakes and
25 tributaries; and

26 **WHEREAS**, Recreational fishing and boating are excellent
27 opportunities for families to spend time together, and for children to
28 learn more about aquatic life and the environment; and

29 **WHEREAS**, Fishing and boating are also believed by many to be
30 significant stress-relieving activities; and

31 **WHEREAS**, People who fish and boat are also more likely to value and
32 help conserve the environment, and funds from fishing licenses,
33 boat registrations, and excise taxes in New Jersey and across the
34 country go toward conservation of natural aquatic areas; and

35 **WHEREAS**, National Fishing and Boating Week, which often takes
36 place at the beginning of June, highlights the importance of fishing
37 and boating in enhancing people’s quality of life and preserving the
38 country’s natural beauty; and

39 **WHEREAS**, By designating New Jersey Fishing and Boating Week in
40 June, it is hoped that this will encourage all people to participate in
41 fishing and boating, and enjoy the natural beauty of the State in one
42 of the best months to take it in; now, therefore,

43
44 **BE IT RESOLVED** *by the Senate and General Assembly of the*
45 *State of New Jersey:*

47 1. The first full week of June of each year is designated as
48 “New Jersey Fishing and Boating Week,” in order to highlight the

1 importance of fishing and boating in enhancing people’s quality of
2 life and in preserving the State’s natural beauty.

4 2. The Governor may annually issue a proclamation calling
5 upon public officials and citizens of the State to observe “New
6 Jersey Fishing and Boating Week” with appropriate activities and
7 programs.

9 3. The Division of Fish and Wildlife shall take appropriate
10 measures each year to publicize “New Jersey Fishing and Boating
11 Week,” and coordinate at least one of the State’s free fishing days,
12 selected pursuant to section 1 of P.L.1985, c.352 (C.23:3-1b), with
13 that week.

15 4. This joint resolution shall take effect immediately.
