Amends Constitution to prohibit construction of new fossil fuel power plants.

1 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION proposing to amend Article I of the 2 New Jersey Constitution by adding a new paragraph thereto. 3 4 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the State of New Jersey (the 5 General Assembly concurring): 6 7 The following proposed amendment to the Constitution of 1. 8 the State of New Jersey is agreed to: 9 PROPOSED AMENDMENT 10 11 12 Amend Article I of the State Constitution by the addition of the 13 following paragraph: 14 24. No person shall construct or reconstruct, and the State shall 15 not permit or otherwise approve the construction or reconstruction 16 of, any new electric power generation facility in the State that 17 produces electric power, in whole or in part, from the combustion of 18 coal, natural gas, oil, or petroleum products. The prohibition in 19 this paragraph shall not apply to the repair or maintenance of an 20 electric power generation facility in existence prior to the adoption 21 of this amendment. 22 23 2. When this proposed amendment to the Constitution is finally 24 agreed to pursuant to Article IX, paragraph 1 of the Constitution, it 25 shall be submitted to the people at the next general election occurring more than three months after the final agreement and 26 27 shall be published at least once in at least one newspaper of each county designated by the President of the Senate, the Speaker of the 28 29 General Assembly and the Secretary of State, not less than three 30 months prior to the general election. 31 32 3. This proposed amendment to the Constitution shall be 33 submitted to the people at that election in the following manner and 34 form: 35 There shall be printed on each official ballot to be used at the 36 general election, the following: In every municipality in which voting machines are not used, 37 a. a legend which shall immediately precede the question as follows: 38 39 If you favor the proposition printed below make a cross (X), plus (+), or check (\checkmark) in the square opposite the word "Yes." If you are 40 opposed thereto make a cross (X), plus (+) or check (\checkmark) in the 41 42 square opposite the word "No." 43 44 b. In every municipality the following question:

N	10	INTERPRETIVE STATEMENT This amendment to the State Constitution would prohibit the construction of new fossil fuel power plants in the State. Fossil fuel power plants produce electricity by burning coal, oil, natural gas, or other petroleum products. This amendment would also prohibit the State from approving the construction of new fossil fuel power plants. The prohibition would not apply to the repair and maintenance of existing fossil fuel power plants.

STATEMENT

5 This constitutional amendment would prohibit the construction 6 of new fossil fuel power plants in the State.

7 Fossil fuel power plants produce electricity by burning coal, oil, 8 natural gas, or other petroleum products. The burning of these fuels 9 produces greenhouse gases, which contribute to climate change. 10 New Jersey is already experience the impacts of climate change, as 11 evidenced by warmer temperatures, changing weather patterns, 12 more severe storms, sea level rise, dangerous algal blooms, and the spread of vector-borne diseases. Average temperatures in the State 13 14 have climbed by 2 degrees Celsius since 1895 – double the average 15 for the lower 48 states. Nine of the ten hottest calendar years on record for the State have occurred since 1990. The Special Report 16 17 of the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change, issued in 18 October 2018, found that greenhouse gas emissions must be 19 reduced from 2010 levels by 45 percent by 2030 and to net zero by 20 2050 in order to limit the rise in atmospheric temperature to 1.5 21 degrees Celsius, a level that results in severe ecological, health, and 22 economic impacts.

Fossil fuel power plants are one of the largest sources of greenhouse gas emissions in the State, and a significant source of air pollution. Despite this, new fossil fuel power plants and related infrastructure continue to be proposed and constructed in New

Jersey. In 2007, the Legislature adopted the "Global Warming 1 Response Act," which requires the State to reduce its emissions to 2 3 80 percent below the 2006 level by the year 2050. In order to meet 4 this ambitious target, and curb the effects of climate change in New 5 Jersey, more aggressive action to curb greenhouse gas emissions is 6 needed. This constitutional amendment would prohibit the 7 construction or reconstruction of new fossil fuel power plants in the State. It would also prohibit the State from permitting or otherwise 8 9 approving new fossil fuel power plants. The constitutional 10 amendment would not apply to the repair or maintenance of an 11 existing fossil fuel power plant.
