12	Amend Article I by adding a new paragraph 24 to read as

14	24. (a) Every person has a right to a clean and healthy		
15	environment, including pure water, clean air, ¹ a safe climate, ¹ and		
16	ecologically healthy habitats, and to the preservation of the natural		
17	¹ [,] <u>and</u> ¹ scenic ¹ [, historic, and esthetic] qualities of the		
18	environment. The State shall not infringe upon these rights ¹ [, by		
19	action or inaction] ¹ .		
20	(b) The State's ¹ [public] ¹ natural resources, among them its		
21	waters, air, flora, fauna, climate, and public lands, are the common		
22	property of all the people, including both present and future		
23	generations. The State shall serve as trustee of these resources, and		
24	shall conserve and maintain them for the benefit of all people.		
25	(c) This paragraph and the rights stated herein are (1) self-		
26	executing, and (2) shall be in addition to any rights conferred by the		
27	public trust doctrine or common law. ¹ Nothing in this paragraph		
28	shall abrogate the applicable Rules of Court that prohibit the filing		
29	of frivolous claims. ¹

31	2. When this proposed amendment to the Constitution is finally		
32	agreed to pursuant to Article IX, paragraph 1 of the Constitution, it		
33	shall be submitted to the people at the next general election

SCHEDULE

This constitutional amendment shall become part of the Constitution on March 1 next following the general election at which it is approved by the voters.
